Exhibitors must be members of the Society. Entries must be in **Wednesday, September 1st 2021 between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.** No late entries please. **Entries must be picked up Monday, September 6th between 3:00 and 4:00 p.m. Entries cannot be removed before this time. If entries are removed before the designated time no prize money can be awarded.** One entry only per person per class is permitted. Entries must be grown by the exhibitor. **Entries must be accompanied by entry form, membership number and tags.** If required, use a heavy Styrofoam or aluminum plate. Baskets must be clean and solid. All entries should have the variety named if possible. Root crops should be lightly clean with a brush, but not washed. Their freshness will last longer.

SEED

Entries MUST be shown in bags available from the Pontiac Agricultural Society office. Quantities: **8 pounds (3.6 kg)** for large seed or **4 pounds (1.8 kg)** for small seeds. Entries must have exact quantities and must be grown by the exhibitor not more than 1 year prior to the Fair. **All varieties must be named.**
