ATTENTION ALL JERSEY EXHIBITORS 2021 COVID RULES

All details are subject to approval and recommendation from Santé Publique Québec. We will keep you updated in a timely manner.

- We recommend that you and your helpers get your second dose of vaccine before the Shawville Fair.
- We will be respecting all social distancing rules as required in the barns and show ring. Exhibitors are responsible for providing names and contact information for all helpers to the show committee.
- Barns are open to exhibitors and helpers only, **no general public** allowed inside
- In order to allow distancing all we are asking exhibitors not to store feed, bedding, implements or chairs in the walkways or in front of the barn doors.
- Parking of cattle trailers is permitted on the fair grounds for 2021.
- No ribbons will be awarded this year, prize money remains the same.
- Arrival by Thursday at 12 PM noon at the latest.
- Departure will be allowed once the show is over.
- The show will begin at 11AM on the Friday. The show order may change due to number of entries

ALL SHOWS ARE IN AN OUTDOOR RING. Please be prepared for all kinds of weather. To be shown on Friday at 11 AM. Arrival permitted on Wednesday.

- This show is open to exhibitors from all regions.
- All exhibitors must become members of the Pontiac Agricultural Society (PAS)
- Every exhibitor is required to forward with their entry form a **certificate of proof of liability insurance** for the current year (minimum of \$1,000,000 is required) and membership fee. Entries will not be processed until this information is received.
- Entries are to be sent to Pontiac Agricultural Society, Box 149, Shawville QC J0X 2Y0. Entries must be received in the Fair office **August 30, 2021**.
- Entries are also due on **AssistExpo by August 30, 2021**.
- Entry fee: 15% of the prize money won by the exhibitor.
- It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall so hold the Pontiac Agricultural Society and/or the committee blameless for any loss or accident. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall be responsible for any injury or damage that may be occasioned to any person or thing whomever or whatever against all claims or demands for loss or damage occasioned thereby.
- Children under the age of 6 yrs. are not allowed in any of the livestock buildings unless accompanied by an adult.
- Animals showing signs of contagious diseases or parasite infections – i.e. IBR, lice, will not be allowed to remain on the grounds.
- PAS is not liable for any diseases passed from animals at the fair.
- All animals must have ATQ tags or CCIA identification tags. If an animal does not have proper identification tags, the animal in question will be asked to leave the grounds.
- Passes are allotted **2 passes for every 4 head to be shown**. The passes will be distributed once exhibits are checked in by the show committee.
- In order to have access to the restricted zone during livestock shows, all livestock exhibitors and helpers will be required to wear a unique wristband to identify them to Security. The wristband will be issued by the dairy show committee.
- An exhibit is interpreted as follows: a dairy animal qualifying for an entry into a class as specified in the Classifications. All registered animals, 75% or higher in purity, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly), are considered to be the production of the exhibitor.
- All exhibits must be registered in the name of the exhibitor in accordance with the by-laws of their respective breed association.
- An exhibitor is any breeder or firm which presents animals for official placing by a judge at the time specified by the fair/exhibition for judging.
- NUMBER OF EXHIBITS PER EXHIBITOR: Maximum of 15 animals. No limit on number of exhibits per class. Premier Exhibitor points on 10 animals only. Premier Breeder points on 10 animals bred but not necessarily owned by the exhibitor.
- Each animal will be checked against its pedigree on Thursday of the Fair by the show committee.
- A maximum of two (2) substitute animals will be permitted.

- Prior to the set-up of clipping crates, please contact the Director in charge as to the correct location.
- Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring; as well as any conduct that violates, directly or indirectly, recognized by the **Standard Show Practices**, or any other discreditable conduct that could damage the image of the breed or show is considered an infraction and is subject to penalties according to the Jersey Canada Show Conduct Rules.

JUNIOR CLASSES

1. Summer Heifer: Born on or after June 1st 2021
2. Junior Heifer: March 1, 2021 to May 31 2021
3. Intermediate Heifer: December 1, 2020 to February 28, 2021
4. Senior Heifer: September 1 to November 30, 2020
5. Summer Yearling: June 1 to August 31, 2020
6. Junior Yearling: March 1 to May 31, 2020
7. Intermediate Yearling: December 1, 2019 to February 29, 2020
8. Senior yearling born September 1, 2019 to November 30, 2019. Please note for 2021 Milking Senior Yearlings will show in Class #10.

9. JUNIOR HERD - A group of three (3) junior animals per exhibitor, previously exhibited in classes 1-7. Exhibitor must have bred all three (3) animals and own at least one (1). The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as "breeder" of all and as "owner" of at least one, in both cases either as an individual or in partnership

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR BANNER – Sponsored by **TBA**, presented to the individual, partnership or institution having the largest number of points that have been won in the individual classes by not more than nine (9) junior animals owned by the exhibitor. In the case of jointly owned animals, the joint ownership will be considered as one exhibitor and no part of the points awarded will count toward the individual score of any of the joint owners.

JUNIOR BREEDER BANNER – Sponsored by **TBA.**, presented to the individual, partnership or institution having the largest number of points that have been won in the individual classes 1-7 by not more than nine (9) junior animals, bred but not necessarily owned by the winner. In the case of jointly bred animals, the prefix of the animal will be followed in awarding the points.

Points will be awarded on the following basis for both Junior Banners on the following basis:

SENIOR MILKING CLASSES:

10. Junior Two year old: March 1, 2019 to August 31, 2019.
11. Senior Two year old: September 1, 2018 to February 28, 2019.
12. Three year old: September 1, 2017 to August 31, 2018.
13. Four year old: September 1, 2016 to August 31, 2017.
14. Five year old: September 1, 2015 to August 31, 2016.
15. Mature Cow born prior to September 1, 2015.
16. Senior Breeder's Herd. Three animals from the same breeding unit. The exhibitor must solely or jointly own at least one animal in the group; the other two animals in the group may be owned by other exhibitors. Prize money: \$150, \$130, \$115, \$95, \$90, \$80, \$75, \$65, \$50, \$30. Note: Prize money will be awarded to **one entry/exhibitor** but exhibitor may show more than one herd in this class.

GRAND CHAMPION

RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION

(An Honorable Mention will be recorded)

BEST UDDER CHAMPIONSHIP – Judge shall declare one best udder in each senior class from 3 year old to Mature Cow and designate overall champion best udder.

BEAUTY AND UTILITY – Highest BCA on completed official record among the 1st and 2nd place females in classes 10 to 15. If a tie results, the winner will be declared on the highest BCA for protein.

TIE STALL COMPETITION – not applicable for 2021

SENIOR BANNERS:

PREMIER EXHIBITOR BANNER – Premier Exhibitor Banner, sponsored by **TBA**, is presented to the individual, partnership or institution having the largest number of points that have been won in the individual classes by not more than ten animals owned by the exhibitor. This does not limit the number of animals that may be shown. In the case of jointly owned animals, the joint ownership will be considered as one exhibitor and no part of the points awarded will count toward the individual score of any of the joint owners.

PREMIER BREEDER BANNER – Premier Breeder Banner, sponsored by **TBA**, is presented to the breeding unit (individual, partnership or institution) having the highest number of points won in individual female classes by not more than ten animals bred, but not necessarily owned, by the winner. Calculation of Premier Breeder is readily determined in all identified cases from certificates of registry, either directly from the breeder section or, in the case of a within-herd family transfer with former membership and alphanumeric code, by utilization of the animal's prefix. In the case of jointly bred animals, a joint breeding is considered as **one** breeding unit. No part of the points awarded counts toward the individual score of any of the joint owners.
