

ATTENTION ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

Please take note that all animals arriving on the Fair grounds may be clinically examined for contagious diseases by a veterinarian. Animals having such diseases will be subject to refusal to the Fair. The decision of the veterinarian is final. Pontiac Agricultural Society is not liable for any diseases passed from animals at the Fair.

Every exhibitor is required to forward with their entry form a certificate of proof of liability insurance for the current year (minimum of \$1,000,000 is required), and membership fee. Entries will not be processed until this information is received, and will be subject to late entry fee of 25% of gross prize money. Entries are to be sent to Pontiac Agricultural Society, Box 149, Shawville QC J0X 2Y0. Entries must be received in the Fair office or postmarked by August 10, 2018. Entries may be done on-line at AssistExpo by August 10, 2018.

ATTENTION ALL CATTLE EXHIBITORS

-All dairy cattle must be on the grounds by 12:00 noon Friday, August 31, 2018 and must remain until 1:00 p.m. Sunday, September 2, 2018. **Cattle must remain in the barn exhibit until 1:00 p.m. on Sunday. If animals are removed before the designated time no prize can be attributed.** For beef cattle schedule see Section 21.

-All exhibitors must become members of the Pontiac Agricultural Society.

-Every exhibitor is required to forward with their entry form a certificate of proof of liability insurance for the current year (minimum of \$1,000,000 is required) and membership fee. Entries will not be processed until this information is received, and will be subject to late entry fee of 25% of gross prize money. Entries are to be sent to Pontiac Agricultural Society, Box 149, Shawville QC J0X 2Y0. Entries must be received in the Fair office or postmarked by August 10, 2018. Entries may be done on-line at AssistExpo by August 10, 2018.

-Entry fee: 15% of prize money won by the exhibitor.

-All exhibitors are asked not to store feed, bedding or implements in the walkways, pathways or in front of buildings as to impede the movement of the general public or in any way to take away from the appearance of the exhibits.

-Protests shall be lodged with the Director of the division or the Fair office on the day of show. All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by \$100.00 cash or a certified cheque payable to Pontiac Agricultural Society. The director's decision is final. No protest shall impede the schedule of the show or flow of classes.

-It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall so hold the Pontiac Agricultural Society and/or the committee blameless for any loss or accident. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall be responsible for any injury or damage that may be occasioned to any person or thing whomever or whatever against all claims or demands for loss or damage occasioned thereby.

-Children under the age of 6 years will not be allowed in any of the livestock buildings unless accompanied by an adult.

-No dogs are allowed on the grounds.

-Animals showing signs of contagious diseases or parasite infections – i.e. lice, will not be allowed to remain on the grounds.

-Pontiac Agricultural Society is not liable for any diseases passed from animals at the Fair.

-All animals must have Quebec ATQ tags or Ontario identification tags. If an animal does not have proper identification tags, the animal in question will be asked to leave the grounds.

-Volunteer exhibitors are needed for cleanup after show.

-Passes are allotted as: helper – 1 pass for every 4 head; vehicle – 1 pass for 6 head, maximum of 2, the second vehicle must park off-site. Passes will be distributed after animals have been checked in by the Director.

-In order to have access to the back of the arena during livestock shows, all livestock exhibitors and helpers will be required to wear a unique wristband to identify them to Security. The wristband will be issued by the Director of the division.

-PAS is not liable for any damage on trucks or cars. Park at your own risk.

-Vehicle passes must be properly attached to the vehicle to obtain entry to the fair grounds. Vehicles with no pass may be subject to removal.

Entries are to be sent to Pontiac Agricultural Society, Box 149, Shawville QC J0X 2Y0. Entries must be received in the Fair office or postmarked by August 10, 2018. -Entry fee: 15% of prize money won by the exhibitor.

- An exhibit is interpreted as follows: a dairy animal qualifying for an entry into a class as specified in the Classifications. All registered animals, 75% or higher in purity, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly), are considered to be the production of the exhibitor.
- All exhibits must be registered in the name of the exhibitor in accordance with the by-laws of their respective breed association.
- An exhibitor is any breeder or firm which presents animals for official placing by a judge at the time specified by the fair/exhibition for judging.
- NUMBER OF EXHIBITS PER EXHIBITOR: Maximum of 15 animals. No limit on number of exhibits per class. Premier Exhibitor points on 10 animals only. Premier Breeder points on 10 animals bred but not necessarily owned by the exhibitor.
- Barn space is limited, first registered first served.
- Each animal will be checked against its pedigree on Friday of the Fair by the show committee.
- A maximum of two (2) substitute animals will be permitted.
- Fax copies of registration papers must have official Holstein Canada stamp.
- Milker pump must not be operated after 2:00 p.m. Saturday until after show on Saturday night.
- Prior to the set-up of clipping crates, please contact the Director in charge as to the correct location.
- Cattle must remain in the barn exhibit until 1:00 p.m. on Sunday. If animals are removed before the designated time no prize can be attributed.**
- Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring; as well as any conduct that violates, directly or indirectly, recognized standard show practices, or any other discreditable conduct that could damage the image of the breed or show is considered an infraction and is subject to penalties according to the Holstein Canada guidelines.

Entries will not be processed until this information is received, and will be subject to late entry fee of 25% of gross prize money. Entries are to be sent to Pontiac Agricultural Society, Box 149, Shawville QC J0X 2Y0. Entries must be received in the Fair office or postmarked by August 10, 2018. Entries may be done on-line at AssistExpo by August 10, 2018.

-Steer project must be registered with the Shawville Fair steer Director by no later than May 15th preceding the current fair.

Registration will be by entry form and paid Pontiac Agricultural Society membership and 4-H dues.

-ATQ tag number must be provided upon registration.

-Each member will be allowed one "spare" steer, as long as it is pre-registered by May 15th by registration form indicating ATQ or CCIA number. A "spare" steer must be housed with and managed in the same manner as the exhibitor's main 4-H project. A group of steer club members whose steers are housed together may share a common "spare" steer, or each pre-register one specific spare steer as long as their intentions are indicated by registration form by May 15th. A steer club member must exhibit either his/her main 4-H project or the spare steer they have pre-registered. It is not mandatory for a steer club member to have a "spare" steer.

-It is not mandatory that steers be housed at the exhibitor's residence but the exhibitor must be involved in the husbandry and the preparation of the steer from May 15th on.

-Steers and "spare" steers must be available for inspection at all times.

-Steers must be on the fair grounds by Thursday, August 30, 2018 at 1:00 p.m. Steers arriving late will be penalized a shrink of 1% body weight for each hour late of indicated time.

-Steers will be weighed Thursday, August 30 at 6:30 p.m.

-Exhibitor will be paid for 1,300 pounds maximum.

-Exhibitor must attend a combination of four (4) 4-H and/or steer club meetings in the current year.

-All animals are the responsibility of the exhibitor until removed from fair grounds.

-All animals deemed to be a safety hazard by the committee will not be permitted to show and/or be sold.

-All steers must be finished in order to sell in the sale.

-All steers shown must be sold by auction. The order of sale will be determined by the steer Director.

-Each 4-H member must complete and present to 4-H leaders by August 15 a project sheet for at least one of their 4-H projects in order to participate in achievement day.

-Each exhibitor must show in both his/her breed and showmanship classes. Any exhibitor failing to do so will be disqualified and will not be awarded any prize money, trophies, points or recognition for his/her show. Those not following this rule will be asked to remove their calf/steer from the grounds. This rule applies to both 4-H calf and steer projects. Steer exhibitors not abiding by this rule will also forfeit their opportunity to participate in the steer sale. A club member must exhibit either his/her main 4-H project or the spare lamb/goat they have pre-registered. It is not mandatory for a club member to have a "spare" lamb/goat.

-It is not mandatory that the lamb/goat be housed at the exhibitor's residence but the exhibitor must be involved in the husbandry and the preparation of the lamb/goat from May 15th on.

-Lamb/goat and "spare" lamb/goat must be available for inspection at all times.

-Lamb/goat must be on the fair grounds by Thursday, August 30, 2018 at 1:00 p.m. Lamb/goat arriving late will be penalized a shrink of 1% body weight for each hour late of indicated time.

-Lambs/goats will be weighed Thursday, August 30 at 6:30 p.m.

-Lambs must weigh a minimum of 90 lbs. and will be paid to 120 pounds maximum. Goats must weigh a minimum of 60 lbs. and will be paid to 100 pounds maximum.

-Exhibitor must attend a combination of four (4) 4-H and/or steer club meetings in the current year.

-Market lambs must be wethers (castrated males) or females. No signs of late castration will be accepted.

-All animals are the responsibility of the exhibitor until removed from fair grounds.

-All animals deemed to be a safety hazard by the committee will not be permitted to show and/or be sold.

-All lambs/goats must be finished in order to sell in the sale.

-All lambs/goats shown must be sold by auction. The order of sale will be determined by the Director.

-Each 4-H member must complete and present to 4-H leaders by August 15 a project sheet for at least one of their 4-H projects in order to participate in achievement day.

-Market lamb/goat may be used for 4-H points but not shown in other classes.

-For showmanship classes lambs must be shown without halter.

-Animals must be owned by exhibitor by May 15 of the current year.
