All Exhibitors must be members of the Pontiac Agricultural Society. Memberships can be purchased that the Fair Board Office at 215 Lang Street, Shawville, Quebec for 2026 Exhibitors. Memberships for Exhibitors are only available prior to the start of the fair - Wednesday, September 2 at 9:00 pm deadline.

All entries must be in Wednesday, September 2, 2026 between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. only. Judging is on Thursday, September 3 at 9:00 a.m. sharp - closed to the public.

Exhibits must be picked up Monday, September 7, 2026 between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Entries cannot be removed before this time. If entries are removed before the designated time no prize money can be awarded to the Exhibitor. Those articles not claimed will remain at the owner's risk.

NO CARS ON SITE UNTIL AFTER 4:00 PM.

One entry per person per class.

Entries must be accompanied by entry form, membership number and tags.

Any exhibit not worthy of a prize will not receive it, even if there are no other exhibits.

The whole pie or cake must be brought in for judging and only one piece will be displayed. The rest of the pie or cake may be picked up Thursday evening from 7:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Baking receiving no prize may be picked up the day of judging from 7:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. by the exhibitor from the Director in charge.

While the Board will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of the exhibits, they wish it to be understood that the owners themselves are taking the risk of exhibiting them.
